COURSE DESCRIPTION
Within the scope of this course, the basic issues in Turkish foreign policy are evaluated in the light of case studies from various periods, taking into account the connection between Turkiye's security and foreign policy.
COURSE OBJECTIVES
The aim of the course is to help the post graduate students of UGİ-Master of Arts programme to develop an understanding and knowledge on the determinants of Turkish foreign policy, the main security problems that Turkiye faces, and the capacities that are available for Turkish policy makers when dealing with those problems.

COURSE ORGANIZATION

1. Week	Foreign and security policy (basic concepts). The determinants of Turkish foreign policy.
2. Week	Foreign policy during the Turkish struggle for independence. The treaty of Lausanne.
3. Week	The policy of neutrality during the 1923-1936 period (with case studies).
4. Week	Efforts to maintain the policy of neutrality between 1936 and 1939; the Hatay issue and foreign policy during World War II.
5. Week	Entering the Western alliance and the alliance-oriented foreign policy in the 1945-1960 period.
6. Week	Foreign policy of the military administration; the implications of Cuban Missile Crisis for Turkiye; Cyprus developments and the Johnson letter.
7. Week	Problems with the USA (1965-1979): the issue of bilateral agreements; the poppy crisis and the American embargo.
8. Week	The revision of alliance-oriented foreign policy: Multi-dimensional foreign policy (1965-1979).
9. Week	The return to alliance-oriented foreign policy in the 1980s: the military rule; security issues during Özal's prime ministry.
10. Week	The 1990s: The new world order and Turkish foreign policy; Conflicts in the Balkans and Turkiye.

11. Week	The search for security in the 1990s: Türkiye's relations with Greece, Syria, Israel and Russia.
12. Week	Turkish foreign policy in the 1990-1991 Gulf crisis; the operations of Provide Comfort and Northern Watch (1991-2003).
13. Week	The invasion of Iraq in 2003, the rejection of March 1 motion by Turkish parliament and Turkish-American relations in the 2000s.
14. Week	General Evaluation.
